



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4. Stop pushing



EXTRAS:

For a rapid 180 degree turn : Place pole as shown near the water surface (but beneath it) and sweep around - this may need repeating to turn the punt fully. The Punt will turn about it's centre of gravity but in the opposite direction.



- Build up speed before Bridges & Trees to coast under them
- Use punt pole stuck in mud to pinion the punt to the bank when mooring at the bankside rather than a jetty
- If the pole gets stuck try twisting it but if all else fails <u>LET GO</u> (of the punt pole) rather than fall in! Use the paddle to return to the pole afterwards.
- If you fall in don't drink the water. If you do see a doctor!
- Only let one person stand at a time especially when changing over punters.

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
