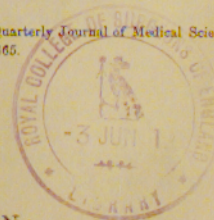

Tracts and pamphlets



The library has been awarded a second grant of £48,720 from the Research Resources in Medical History grants scheme set up by the [Wellcome Trust](#) and the [British Library](#). The award will allow the College to catalogue its complete collection of tracts and pamphlets by March 2006.

The tracts collection

An estimated 25,000 pamphlets range over all aspects of medicine, not only surgery, as well as natural history to support the College museums. The majority dates from the 19th century, but there are works from as far back as 1570. British, American and continental European items are joined by exotica from Calcutta, Shanghai and Rio de Janeiro.



Many of the pamphlets are scarce, or remain uncatalogued, in British libraries. The collection is rich in individual case reports, university dissertations and addresses to medical societies.
