THE 25TH OXFORD GRADUATE PHILOSOPHY CONFERENCE
13-14th November 2021

We welcome submissions from all graduate students working in philosophy for the 25th Annual Oxford Philosophy Graduate Conference, to be held on 13-14th November 2021 at the University of Oxford.

The University of Oxford's Graduate Philosophy Conference enjoys a reputation as one of the most prestigious philosophy conferences at the graduate level in the United Kingdom.

Papers may be on any topic and from any field in philosophy. We aim to represent a broad range of philosophical traditions and debates, across both theoretical and practical philosophy.

Each student presentation will be followed by a response from a member of the Oxford Philosophy Faculty. All submissions will undergo a double-blind review process. For submission details, see the next page.



Submission details:

The submission deadline is **Monday, 19th July 2021**.

Eligibility: All current graduate students in philosophy may apply, except those students enrolled at Oxford at the time of the conference.

1. All submissions should be made through [the EasyChair portal](#) (instructions are available on [our website](#)). You will need to register for an account.

2. When registering for an account, please include your full name, institutional affiliation, degree program, and contact details. You'll also be asked to specify whether you've studied at Oxford in the past, as we may wish to cap the number of Oxford alumni accepted so as to ensure diversity and maximize outreach.

3. On the submission form, you'll be asked to provide the following:

- a. A preliminary title;
- b. An abstract of no more than 500 words;
- c. Three keywords situating the paper in an area of philosophy; and
- d. The main paper (to be uploaded), which should
 - be strictly under 4,000 words, including title and footnotes (suitable for a 45- minute presentation);
 - be in .doc(x), .txt, or .pdf formats; and
 - contain **no information identifying the author or the author's institutional affiliation**.

4. We particularly encourage submissions by philosophers from groups underrepresented in the discipline.
