Speeches by outgoing committee members

Motions

On training/competing:

1. This AGM notes that:

- a) OUOC have a finish splits league
- b) The finish splits league has not been updated since the great Per Forsberg took the 06/07 title

This AGM believes that:

- a) The finish leg is an important part of an orienteering course
- b) OUOC can shave vital seconds off their race times by keeping this competitive

This AGM therefore resolves to:

a) Make Scott update the finish splits league

Proposed: Tim Beale Seconded: Per Forsberg

Scott: That'll be so much work!

This protest is pretty much ignored.

For: n Against: n-2. Motion passed.

2. This AGM notes that:

5. This AGM notes that:

This AGM believes that:

Proposed: Ruth Holmes Seconded: Tim Beale

Motion passed, barely.
